1	Issuance of citations by ABC agents and other law enforcement officers for violations of the Kansas Liquor Control Act and the Club and Drinking Establishment Act	Citations issued by ABC agents must be given to the licensee or a person in charge of the licensed premises. Any other law enforcement officer who observes a violation must give notice of the violation to the licensee or a person in charge of the licensed premises and then report the violation to ABC for prosecution. <b>Section 1 of HB 2088, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position. <b>Section 2 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
2	Ineligibility for licensure of person with undisclosed beneficial interest in a license	Any person found to have held an undisclosed beneficial interest in a license which was obtained by fraud or any false statement is ineligible to hold a license. <b>Sections 1 and 2 of HB 2089</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 6 and 7 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
3	Treatment of LLCs for licensure purposes under the Kansas Liquor Control Act, the Club and Drinking Establishment Act, and the Kansas Cereal Malt Beverage Act.	LLCs are treated as corporations for licensure purposes except if the LLC is applying for a retailer's license. For retailer's licensure purposes the LLC is treated as a partnership. <b>Sections 1-3 of HB 2125, as amended by HC</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 8-10 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>

4	Powers of the Director of ABC to deny, suspend, involuntarily cancel, and revoke licenses and application of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act	These provisions clarify the administrative powers of the Director of ABC to deny, suspend, involuntarily cancel, or revoke a license, and application of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act. <b>Sections 4-9 and 11-13 of HB 2125, as amended by HC</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 11-16 and 18-20 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
5	Reference Hiram Price Dillion House in public consumption statute	This amendment strikes the Hiram Price Dillion House reference from KSA 41-719. <b>Section 10 of HB 2125, as amended by HC</b>	Same as House position. <b>Section 17 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
6	Authorizing distributors to provide samples of their products	These provisions authorize distributors to provide samples of their products to retailers and at industry seminars. <b>Sections 1-4 of HB 2191</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 21-24 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
7	Prohibiting sales of powdered alcohol	These provisions prohibit the sale of powdered alcohol in any form. <b>Sections 2-4 of HB 2088, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 3-5 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>
8	Sale of infused alcoholic liquor.	This amendment authorizes drinking establishments to sell infused alcoholic liquor from a container other than the original liquor container. <b>Section 1 of HB 2223, as amended by HC</b>	Same as House position. <b>Section 1 of HB 2223, as amended by SC</b>

9	Consumption of alcoholic liquor on public property at events catered by a licensed caterer.	This amendment authorizes the consumption of alcoholic liquor on public property when such consumption is done at an event catered by a licensed caterer. <b>Section 2 of HB 2331, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position. <b>Section 2 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
10	Electronic notification of a catered event.	This amendment requires electronic notice be given to ABC by a licensed caterer at least 48 hours prior to the catered event. <b>Section 3 of HB 2331, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position, except the notification requirement is waived for weddings, funerals, events sponsored by religious institutions, and business, industry, or trade sponsored meetings. <b>Section 3 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
11	Location of a retailer, microbrewery, microdistillery, or farm winery in a core commercial district	This amendment authorizes a city to adopt an ordinance allowing a retailer, microbrewery, microdistillery, or farm winery to be located in a core commercial district regardless of how close such location is to nearby schools or churches. <b>Section 4 of HB 2331, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position. <b>Section 4 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>



12	Additional temporary permits to sell wine and beer at the Kansas State Fair	This amendment authorizes the issuance of additional temporary permits for the sale of wine, beer, or both in the original container and by the drink at the Kansas State Fair. <b>Section 5 of HB 2331, as amended by HCOW</b>	This amendment authorizes the issuance of additional temporary permits after July 1, 2016, as required by the State Fair Board, for the sale of wine in the original container, and wine, beer, or both by the drink at the Kansas State Fair. <b>Section 5 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
13	Consumption of alcoholic liquor on unlicensed business premises when permitted by the business and supplied and consumed by patrons of the business	This amendment authorizes the consumption of alcoholic liquor on unlicensed business premises when permitted by the business and supplied and consumed by patrons of the business. <b>Section 1 of HB 2331, as amended by HCOW</b>	Same as House position. <b>Sections 8 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b> <i>Further amended to limit hours &amp; allow ABC oversight</i>
14	Amendments concerning the sale of wine at farmers' markets	Not included in any legislation.	This amendment sets a permit application fee of \$25, allows for multiple market locations under one permit, and redefines "farmers' market" to remove the reference to inspections by the Dept. of Agriculture. <b>Section 6 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>

15	Marketing of wine and receipt of orders by holders of a special order shipping license	Not included in any legislation. <i>(DID NOT PASS.)</i>	This amendment allows holders of a special order shipping license to market wines and receive orders through any means of communication. <b>Section 7 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
16	Issuance of annual vineyard permits	Not included in any legislation. <i>Senator Baumgardner</i>	This amendment authorizes the issuance of annual vineyard permits to vineyards with at least 100 vines. A permit would allow the permit holder to sell wine produced from the grapes grown by the vineyard. <b>Section 1 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
17	Consumption of alcoholic liquor at the State Capitol	Not included in any legislation. <i>Senator Lynn</i>	This amendment authorizes the consumption of alcoholic liquor in the State Capitol and on the grounds at official state functions approved by the LLC. <b>Section 2 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
18	Automatic self-service wine dispensers	Not included in any legislation. <i>Comes back each year - KS Star Casino</i>	This amendment authorizes automatic self-service wine dispensers, provided such dispensers are monitored and controlled by the licensee. <b>Section 9 of HB 2331, as amended by SCOW</b>
